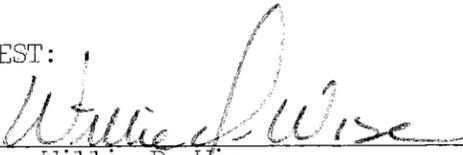
The Board stated that it was Board policy that after October 1, 1982, there was no money budgeted for temporary aid.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSION
MINUTES OF OCTOBER 19, 1982

The Board of County Commission met this day in regular session with the following members present, to-wit: Bobby Varnum, Chairman, Donnell Whitfield, Jack Bowman, Monroe Cox and Clayton Shiver.

Willie D. Wise, Clerk, and Attorney Bill Corbin were present and acting. The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Smith followed with prayer by Commissioner Whitfield.

Carlton Smith, CETA Director, Etta Mae Taylor and Lucretia Leath met with the Board concerning the close-out of last year's grant and stated more help would be needed for this if money was available thru county funds. A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Bowman and duly carried to pay Lucretia Leath for approximately 3 weeks to assist in the close-out.

Mr. E. L. Elofson, Juan Lima and Cary Godwin met with the Board concerning pollution control on the Chipola River within the boundary of Calhoun County. Commissioner Bowman stated that the Apalachee Regional Planning Council was doing a study on the river at this time. A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Whitfield and duly carried to go on record to contact the Apalachee Regional Planning Council to adopt a resolution concerning the pollution in the Chipola and Apalachicola River Basin.

Mr. Darryl Adams met with the Board concerning property on the Four Mile Creek Park. Commissioner Bowman stated that according to the Deed and to Robert Nations, County Engineer, the property discussed belongs to Calhoun County.

Mr. Ray Gordon also addressed the Board on putting a road into his property. Commissioner Bowman stated there was to be no access to Mr. Gordon's property thru the park. Commissioner Whitfield stated he was not for fencing the park unless all persons are prohibited.

Mr. Gordon stated he feels this is a "grudge fence" installed by Commissioner Bowman.

Chairman Varnum asked Commissioner Bowman to sign an easement to build the road. Commissioner Whitfield is for leaving the fence down until the road is in. Commissioner Cox stated Mr. Nations needs to be present when situations like this arise.

Mr. Ellis Melvin met with the Board to ask for work under the Weatherization Program. Commissioner Bowman stated he was for Charles Price and his work crews doing all the work. Commissioner Whitfield, Shiver and Cox stated they had no objections to Mr. Melvin doing some of the work if it could not be handled by Charles and his employees. The Board agreed that all jobs with the county should be advertised in the local paper and brought before the Board.

The Board also discussed Faye Bailey's working and being paid thru HUD and Weatherization. Mike Tucker, CPA, stated that Mrs. Bailey should not be paid from both funds.

Mrs. Alice Daniels with CAP stated that all of the grants should be kept in the County. Commissioner Bowman stated that this may be the solution by turning Weatherization over to CAP.

Mr. Gene Bailey asked for the County's business on the upkeep of the air conditioners and heating units, and stated he could save the County some money.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Shiver and duly carried to accept the Extention Agreement with Mike Tucker, CPA, for audit services for 1982-83.

Mr. Alvin Roberts stated that the doctor at the Calhoun County Health Department wanted 2 bathrooms torn out to make a storage area. Mr. Roberts is to check this out and report back to the Board. Also, the air conditioners at the jail are out. A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Bowman and duly carried to advertise for a new air conditioner.

Mr. Ivey Bailey, a representative with Time Energy, met with the Board and discussed the savings on the utilities for County buildings.

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Shiver and duly carried to start the paving project on the Victory Hill Road after all easements are given. Commissioner Cox stated he would not vote to do it until all easements are given.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Cox and duly carried to re-surface Highway 274 to Ten Mile Creek from Shelton's Store and the Willis Bridge.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Cox and duly carried to appoint Mrs. Jo Ann Melvin to the Library Board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Shiver and duly carried to appoint Drew Peacock to the District 2A Mental Health Board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowman, seconded by Commissioner Whitfield and duly carried to advertise the borrow pit on Highway 274 for sale.

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Shiver and duly carried to cancel the old typewriter maintenance contract and accept the low bid of Jim Wyatt at \$60.00 per machine payable as done.

The minutes of the previous meeting held October 5, 1982, were read and approved.

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Shiver and duly carried to notify Gene Lampkins that the City of Blountstown will pick up garbage at Calhoun General Hospital, and this is notification that the Board of County Commission and the Hospital Board was not satisfied with the service rendered to the citizens of Calhoun County.

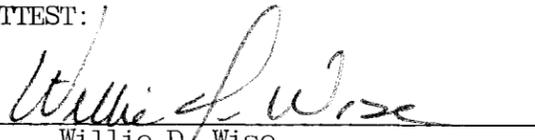
A motion was made by Commissioner Shiver to put a well in for Barney Harvell after reading a letter from the Calhoun County Health Department. Motion seconded by Commissioner Whitfield. Commissioners Varnum, Bowman and Cox voted "no" and Commissioners Shiver and Whitfield voted "yes". Commissioner Cox states this has been brought up before, and that even though the health department said the well was closer to the septic tank than they preferred that the letter from the health department stated their test showed the water to be bacteriologically safe and that Mr. Harvell's water supply is adequate.

Commissioner Varnum is on the screening board for HUD, and stated that no more wells will be put down unless the house is rehabed.
