Commissioner Whitfield stated he would like to add to the Resolution that Calhoun County is economically depressed and has a high unemployment rate.

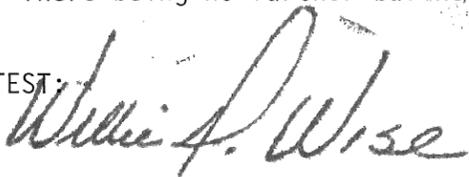
Commissioner Bowman polled the Board regarding acceptance of the addition to the Resolution. All commissioners voted "yes" to the acceptance of the addition.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSION
MINUTES OF JANUARY 18, 1983

The Board of County Commission met this day in regular session with the following members present, to-wit: Jack Bowman, Chairman, Monroe Cox, Drew Peacock, Donnell Whitfield and Roy Bailey.

Deputy Clerk Gail O'Bryan, Attorney Bill Corbin and Sheriff William G. Smith were present and acting. The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Smith followed with prayer by Commissioner Bowman.

Commissioner Bowman stated that since there was such a large crowd attending the meeting, he recommended the meeting be moved to the courtroom.

A motion was made by Commissioner Peacock, seconded by Commissioner Whitfield and duly carried (5-0) to move the meeting to the courtroom because there were approximately 250 people present. The Board adjourned for 10 minutes in order that the meeting could be moved to the courtroom.

Chairman Bowman called to meeting to order in the courtroom, and stated bids were being received from Baxter Asphalt, Gulf asphalt, Florida Asphalt and Okaloosa Asphalt on miscellaneous roads to be paved under the HUD Grant.

Attorney Corbin read the bids and are as follows:

GULF ASPHALT

1. Mix, compact and finish existing sand clay base for the unit price of \$1.16 PER LINEAL FOOT
2. Compact and finish existing sand clay base for the unit price of \$.78 PER LINEAL FOOT
3. Construct 2" compacted thickness sand asphalt surface course 18' wide using 800# Hubbard Field Stability (500# Marshall Stability) asphalt for the unit price of \$4.81 PER LINEAL FOOT OF ROADWAY 18' WIDE
4. Construct 2" compacted thickness sand asphalt surface course 20' wide using 800# Hubbard Field Stability (500# Marshall Stability) asphalt for the unit price of \$5.35 PER LINEAL FOOT OF ROADWAY, 20' WIDE
5. Dress, seed and mulch shoulders (max 6' wide) for the unit price of 6¢ PER LINEAL FOOT

OKALOOSA ASPHALT

1. Mix, compact and finish existing sand clay base, Finish surface to be smooth, uniform and otherwise acceptable to receive asphalt surface course -----\$2.50 per L.F.
2. Compact and finish existing sand clay base, finish surface course to be smooth, uniform and otherwise acceptable to receive asphalt surface course -----\$1.50 per L.F.
3. Application of 2" compacted thickness, sand asphalt hot mix surface course, 800 lbs. stability, Hubbard Field Method Testing, 18 feet in width -----\$5.70 per L.F.

After the reading of the bids, Chairman Bowman suggested that Robert Nations, County Engineer, and Road Superintendent Fernwood Bailey look over the bids and make a report to the Board after reviewing same.

Chairman Bowman presented the bids received for a 15' mower. Attorney Corbin read the bids which are as follows:

Chairman Bowman asked Road Superintendent Fernwood Bailey to look over the bids and report back to the Board after receiving them.

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Robert Nations, County Engineer, after reviewing the bids on the miscellaneous road to be paved under the HUD Grant, stated Gulf Asphalt to be the low bid.

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield to accept the low bid from Gulf Asphalt since they were over \$.50 a running foot cheaper. Motion seconded by Commissioner Cox. Chairman Bowman asked for discussion. Commissioner Whitfield asked the representative from Gulf Asphalt when they could begin the project. The representative stated it was not for him to say.

Chairman Bowman stated the County had had some bad work done by Gulf Asphalt in the last 2 years, and there are 2 jobs that they have not completed. He stated they have promised to come back and patch the Wrennie Moody Road and Hwy. 274 East, but never have. Chairman Bowman called for a vote on the motion by Commissioner Whitfield to accept the low bid from Gulf Asphalt. Motion carried 5-0.

Chairman Bowman requested Mr. Nations to contact James Rowe at Gulf Asphalt and relay the message to him as to the discussion on the Wrennie Moody Road and Hwy. 274 East. Chairman Bowman also requested Mr. Nations to relay the message to Gulf Asphalt that the Board did not want a long delay on the beginning of the new project.

Commissioner Cox asked Mr. Nations if he thought the Board could get some kind of commitment from Gulf Asphalt. Chairman Bowman stated that even though they were low bid, he thought the Board should have some kind of commitment with Gulf Asphalt before they signed the contract. Mr. Nations stated he would contact Gulf Asphalt and see if they could meet the beginning date deadline. Chairman Bowman also stated Baxter Asphalt was the second low bid, and if Gulf Asphalt could not meet the beginning date deadline that Baxter Asphalt be consulted and asked if they could meet the deadline.

Chairman Bowman stated that the Board had not awarded a contract tonight, but were saying Gulf Asphalt was low bid, and until the Board signs the contract, it is not binding. Chairman Bowman also stated that before he signs the contract with Gulf Asphalt, he will be in touch with each Board member, meet with James Rowe at Gulf Asphalt and have Robert Nations, County Engineer, go over the contract.

Commissioner Peacock stated the bid from Anders Equipment on the 15' Woods Mower met with the specifications, and moved that the Board accept the bid from Anders Equipment Company at the price of \$7,793.00. Motion seconded by Commissioner Whitfield and duly carried (5-0).

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield, seconded by Commissioner Peacock and duly carried to accept the low bid from Beard Equipment of the 48" ditch cleaning bucket in the amount of \$940.00. Motion carried 5-0.

Mrs. Lynn Strawn stated she had been present at the last 4 or 5 meetings and had asked at those meetings why the minutes were not read at the beginning of the meeting.

Chairman Bowman polled the Board regarding the reading of the minutes at the beginning of the meeting. All commissioners voted in favor of reading the minutes at the beginning of the meeting.

Chairman Bowman asked Deputy Clerk Gail O'Bryan to read the minutes of the meeting of January 4, 1983. Commissioner Whitfield stopped the reading of the minutes and stated he wanted the statement made by Commissioner Bowman that there had been a vote on taping of the minutes on November 18, 1980, and it had been voted down 3-2. Commissioner Whitfield produced Minute Book I and showed Chairman Bowman there had been a 4-1 vote for taping of the minutes and that Commissioner Whitfield had made the motion to do so. Chairman Bowman apologized to Commissioner Whitfield and stated for the minutes to reflect the correction.

Chairman Bowman asked Deputy Clerk Gail O'Bryan to continue reading the minutes. After the minutes were read, Chairman Bowman asked for any other corrections and stated if there were none, the minutes were approved as read.

Chairman Bowman stated the Board would now take applications for County Attorney. He stated there was one application from an out-of-county attorney, and the advertisement had stated the applicants must be Calhoun County residents. Chairman Bowman asked the Board if they wanted to accept or reject the out-of-county application..

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Mrs. Cleavinger submitted the following figures: \$1,500.00 per year retainer and \$50.00 per hour for any type work which the County might require plus costs.

Mrs. Cleavinger stated the \$1500.00 a year retainer and the \$50.00 per hour rate would save the County money since it was conceivable that there would be times when her services would not be required. Mrs. Cleavinger stated that an outside attorney would not have the conflicts of interest that a local attorney would have. Mrs. Cleavinger stated she would handle phone calls etc. for the \$1500.00 per year retainer and anything other than that would be at an hourly rate. Mrs. Cleavinger answered questions from the audience and members of the Board.

Chairman Bowman asked Mr. Bill Corbin to present his proposal and qualifications for the position of County Attorney. Mr. Corbin read his proposal and qualifications and submitted the following figures of:

Monthly retainer of \$315.00 per month with retainer to be paid for a maximum of 7 hours service.

Florida State Courts - \$45.00 per hour

Federal Courts - \$50.00 per hour

Mr. Corbin stated he had 10 years experience in county government and had represented the county governments or county officials in County Court, Circuit Court, First District Court of Appeals, Second District Court of Appeals, Supreme Court, Federal Court, before Florida Governor and Cabinet, Administrative Proceedings, including Ethics Commission, Florida State Legislature and Industrial Bond Issues. Mr. Corbin also stated he presently represents county officials in 6 proceedings which are still pending.

Mr. Edwin Strawn questioned whether or not Mr. Corbin had received a 30 day written notice of termination from the Board of County Commission. Mr. Corbin stated he had not received notification.

Questions from the audience and members of the Board were answered by Mr. Corbin.

Mrs. Betty Shriver asked Mr. Corbin if he had been given any reason for this termination. Mr. Corbin stated no reason other than when Commissioner Bailey had stated at a Board meeting that it was political. He stated the issue has come up publically 2 months and 2 days ago on November 16, 1982, at the reorganization meeting. He stated this is the 6th consecutive meeting that this has been brought up and to this date not one commissioner, other than Commissioner Whitfield, has talked to him in any manner whatsoever about anything including that issue. He stated he knew no other reason other than political.

Several people in the audience spoke in behalf of Bill Corbin and stating their opposition to his termination including, but not limited to, the following: Col. E. L. Elofson, Betty Shriver, Gerrie Cumbie, Lynn Strawn, Edwin Strawn, Fannie Cantly, Wallace Bailey, Brooks Cobb, Wayne Posey, Willard Smith, Betty Posey, Ray Bailey and Sandra Strickland.

Dr. Brooks Cobb presented the Board with a petition of 188 registered voters stating they were concerned about the way our county government is now being conducted, and asked for reorganization of the Board of County Commission and to elect a new Board Chairman. Dr. Cobb asked that the petition be attached to the minutes of this meeting.

Chairman Bowman asked Frank Baker to read his proposal. Mr. Baker stated he had earlier sent a proposal to the Board with an application, but that was before the Board advertised in the newspaper. Mr. Baker submitted the following figures and qualifications.

Monthly retainer - \$225.00

Hourly rate of \$40.00 per hour for litigation

Mr. Baker stated that he, like Mr. Corbin, was certified to practice in all levels of courts in the State of Florida and in the U.S. District Court in the Northern District of Florida, but had not represented the County for approximately 5 years.

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Mr. Baker stated that in exchange for his retainer he would be present at all Board meetings for as long as they last, or until released by the Board. He stated if he was unable to attend, he would arrange for one of his partners to attend. Mr. Baker stated he had heard about all sorts of conflict of interest and he does not represent St. Joe Paper Company. He stated he represents a department of the Health and Rehab Services called Child Support Enforcement which means he goes out and sues to recover back welfare monies, but does not represent Florida Department of Health and Rehab.

Alvin Williams was present and spoke in behalf of Mr. Baker.

After much discussion by the Board and members of the audience, Commissioner Whitfield stated Bill Corbin had done a good job for the County and has twice as much experience in one case and five times as much as the other attorney that has applied and that Mr. Corbin has more experience in county government, and that he could not see terminating Mr. Corbin. He stated Mr. Corbin had represented the taxpayers of Calhoun County in a good and professional manner. He stated Mrs. Cleavinger was short on experience and was not from Calhoun County.

Chairman Bowman told Mrs. Cleavinger that he appreciated her application, but her prices were quite high and he wished she lived in Calhoun County.

A motion was made by Commissioner Whitfield to retain Bill Corbin as County Attorney based on his qualifications and based on the other law firm having too many conflicts. Motion died for lack of a second.

A motion was made by Commissioner Peacock to hire Frank Baker as County Attorney. Motion seconded by Commissioner Cox.

Commissioner Whitfield asked for the minutes to reflect that Mr. Baker's firm and Mr. Baker himself does have and will have conflicts of interest and could not ethically represent the Board.

The motion to hire Frank Baker as County Attorney carried. Commissioners Bowman, Cox and Peacock voted "yes". Commissioner Whitfield voted "no". Commissioner Bailey abstained due to conflict of interest. (FOR LETTER OF ABSTENTION, SEE SUPPLEMENTAL MINUTE BOOK 1, PAGE 04, SECTION E)

Commissioner Whitfield recommended that the Board honor Mr. Corbin's contract, and that a letter be written giving Mr. Corbin 30 days notice of termination.

Commissioner Bowman polled the Board on Commissioner Whitfield's recommendation. Commissioners Peacock, Bailey, Cox and Whitfield said "yes" and Chairman Bowman said "no".

Mr. Corbin asked the Board did they want him to withdraw from the pending cases after this 30 day notice of termination is received.

Chairman Bowman stated, speaking for himself and as Chairman of the Board, that as of right now Bill Corbin was terminated as County Attorney.

Commissioners Cox and Peacock stated if Mr. Corbin has 30 days written notice that they thought he should also serve the 30 day period. Commissioner Whitfield stated it was foolish to waste taxpayer's money duplicating services. Chairman Bowman stated he recommended to pay Mr. Corbin's salary of \$500.00, terminate him and have Mr. Baker take over the duties now.

Mr. Baker stated he would work free of retainer for the month of February, 1983.

Chairman Bowman polled the Board on his recommendation to pay Mr. Corbin his salary of \$500.00 and go on with county business since Mr. Baker had agreed to work for nothing for the month of February, and at this time to turn all suits over to our County Attorney, Frank Baker.

Commissioner Whitfield stated the Board had already been polled on honoring Mr. Corbin's contract, and he would not vote on it again. The Board agreed for Mr. Corbin's contract to be honored and to have him serve until March 1, 1983, and at that time Mr. Baker will take over as County Attorney.

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Mr. Corbin stated he had two statements to make concerning this issue. NO. 1 - Mr. Corbin stated he understood Mr. Baker, after the advertisement in the County Record appeared, submitted to the Board a sealed proposal and that it has not been opened. NO. 2 - Mr. Corbin said he thought the Board and the members of the public ought to know the contents of that envelop.

Mr. Baker stated he turned in an application and proposal before the advertisement was in the newspaper.

Chairman Bowman asked Mr. Baker to read the proposal in question. Mr. Baker read the proposal and again stated he had submitted the proposal before the Board advertised the position. Mrs. Baker's proposal dated January 3, 1983, with an attached letter dated December 7, 1982, stated the following figures:

\$450.00 monthly retainer

\$40.00 per hour litigation-State Courts

\$50.00 per hour Federal Courts

Mr. Corbin stated there had been some complaints about this whole issue coming up the way it had and the publicity. He said "he would like to state to each member of the Board, excluding Commissioner Whitfield, personally and to the members of the public that there is no reason for this to have happened. All that needed to happen Mr. Cox, Mr. Peacock, Mr. Bowman, is for 3 members privately to indicate to me, not necessarily together, but individually, man to man, face to face, and tell me that you wanted a change. It makes no difference who you might want, just the fact that you wanted me out as County Attorney. That's all you needed to do, and I would have resigned instantly. Nobody had the nerve or whatever it takes or the manliness to come to me, man to man. That's all you needed to do Mr. Peacock, Mr. Cox and Mr. Bowman. Nobody has ever done it. I've been here for 10 years, and nobody has ever had a complaint with me, never had any complaint at all that they ever told me about. You don't have to have a complaint. All you had to do was let me know. This is the 6th consecutive meeting that has been open to the public, except the HUD meeting that Mr. Bowman and some of the others tried to slip it in on December 15, after telling the public on December 7, 1982, that it would not come up anymore until December 21. Nobody is yet to have the guts to come to me and shake my hand and tell me to get lost, and that's all you needed to do. You don't need to make a big deal employing the County Attorney, but to go through all this turmoil? I didn't cause this. You caused it. You guys are the ones that started it, going behind closed doors, just like I think Mrs. Strawn made the statement on the 21st of December, it's already been decided, it just hasn't been voted on yet and that's exactly what has happened. This is not the only time it has happened in 10 years. I've seen it happen many times, but you gentlemen violated the Sunshine Law as you probably have been told. But that's alright, but you didn't have to do it. It was needless, all this expense, publicity, bad publicity, and God knows Calhoun County has had enough of it, and this is all because 3 of you didn't have the guts to stand up and speak to me man to man and say "we want Frank or somebody else". That's all you had to do. I'm sorry you had to go about your business for the County that way, but you made the choice and you will have to live with it."

The Board recessed for 5 minutes.

After the Board reconvened, Brooks Cobb stated he had presented a petition to the Board requesting reorganization of the Board and the election of a new chairman and would like to have a vote on that.

Chairman Bowman polled the Board about removing him as Chairman.

Commissioner Whitfield stated "I didn't vote for you the first time Jack". Commissioners Bailey, Cox and Peacock said "no".

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The petition presented is as follows:

WE THE UNDERSIGNED CITIZENS AND REGISTERED VOTERS OF CALHOUN COUNTY BEING CONCERNED ABOUT THE WAY OUR COUNTY GOVERNMENT IS NOW BEING CONDUCTED ARE ASKING THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS BE RE-ORGANIZED AND ELECT A NEW BOARD CHAIRMAN.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bailey, seconded by Commissioner Cox and duly carried to accept the Library Contract with Northwest Regional Library.

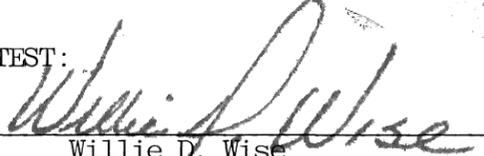
