BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
MINUTES OF MEETING  
AUGUST 19, 1986

The Board of County Commissioners met this date in regular session with the following members present, to wit: Chairman Charles Richards, Commissioners Emmanuel Hires, Roy Bailey, Drew Peacock, and Ronald Wood.

Clerk Wise, Deputy Clerk, Gail O'Bryan, Attorney David House and Deputy Vickery were present and acting.

The meeting was called to order by Deputy Vickery and followed with prayer by Commissioner Wood and pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The minutes of the meeting held August 5, 1986 were read.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bailey, seconded by Commissioner Peacock, and duly carried to accept the minutes of the meeting held August 5, 1986, as read.

Mr. Tony Arrant with Clark, Roumolis, and Association was present at the board meeting to explain work being done by his firm on up dating the comprehensive plan for Calhoun County. The board and Mr. Arrant discussed the planning commission and decided to keep the present members on the board and to coordinate the board so that each district, City of Blountstown, and City of Altha are represented.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hires, seconded by Commissioner Peacock, and duly carried to accept the work thus far done by Clark, Roumoulis Assoc. on the comprehensive plan and to direct the Clerk to cut the draw down checks for same, as necessary.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bailey, seconded by Commissioner Peacock, and duly carried to appoint a new planning commission by each board member appointing 1 member City of Blountstown appoint 1 member, City of Altha appoint 1 member, planning commission appoint 2 members, at large, and for each present planning commission member to be contacted and be allowed to serve, if they so desire.

A motion was made by Commissioner Peacock, seconded by Commissioner Hires, and duly carried to adopt the addendum to the contract on the comprehensive plan for Calhoun County.

The board, by consensus changed the date of the next regularly scheduled board meeting to Wednesday, September 3, 1986, due to September 2nd, 1986, being election day.

Mr. Dan Thomas, Rita Maupin, and Irene Sellers, Calhoun County Library Board, were present at the board meeting to request the board to draft and ordinance for free library service as required by F. S. Mr. Thomas reported the library board is advertising for a Librarian with a masters degree.

The board recessed for 10 minutes.

The board reconvened.

Mr. Dalton Hagler, Chamber of Commerce Director, made a presentation to the board on projects that the Chamber is currently working on, such as a power plant, using household waste, and possible industrial park site. Mr. Hagler stated he had attended a meeting with Logan Barbee and the University of Florida regarding the possibility of a poultry processing plant coming to Calhoun County. Mr. Hagler reported Raffied Industries of Port St. Joe had made an inquiry regarding a fishery coming to Calhoun County. He also stated that Logan Barbee the County Extension Director, was looking into the possibility of an agricultural park for Calhoun County.

Mr. Hagler presented and showed a promotional video for Calhoun County.

A motion by was made by Commissioner Wood, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, and duly carried to approve bonds and license to carry firearms previously approved by the Sheriff's Department for Gail Weinsheimer and David L. Weinshiemer.

Commissioner Hires stated if funds are available he would like to lower the ceiling and insulate some in the Kinard Library.

The board agree to table the Kinard Library issue until the next budget hearing to see if funds are available in this years budget for the above mentioned.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bailey, but died for lack of a second to adhere to the resolution and leave it on the ballot for the people of Calhoun County to vote Yes or No for single member districts.

Commissioner Hires stated he felt it was in the best interest of the board and the county to look into the ballot issue further before making any decision.

A motion was made by Commissioner Wood, seconded by Commissioner Hires, and duly carried to adopt a resolution that will nulify and void the resolution adopted by the Board of County Commissioners wherein said board asked the Supervisor of Elections to place on the ballot the issue of whether the county should go single member districts because the issue has been resolved by the Federal Court and is a mute issue.

Clerk Wise stated he, DALton Hagler, and Commissioner Peacock had attended a meeting in Chipley with Bill Wadell, and stated it was almost 99% sure that the Department of Transportation was not going to approve the change orders as requested by the Board of County Commissioners. He stated you could use the grant if you go with the 60 feet right of way and meet DOT specks.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hires, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, and duly carried to adjourn.
