The Board of County Commissioners met this date in special session for the purpose of holding a public hearing regarding Recontek locating in Calhoun County.

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Smith and followed with prayer by Commissioner Whitfield.

The following experts in chemistry, engineering and environmentlists spoke and presented information and their professional opinions regarding the safety of the materials used for recycling and the processes used by Recontek for recycling.

After presentations by the above professionals, approximately 23 Calhoun County citizens expressed their opinions, both in favor of and against Recontek's locating in Calhoun County. *Lie*

After several hours of discussion and questions, Lisa DeBrewer, attorney for Recontek requested that the Board of County Commissioners of Calhoun County adopt a Resolution accepting Recontek into Calhoun County, to authorize its chairman, after approval by the board attorney and a hazardous waste consultant, to execute the siting agreement approving a waste recycling plant with appropriate approval of DER and to work with Recontek in the procuring and issuance of up to 15 million in Industrial Revenue Bonds.

After discussion, Commissioner Whitfield polled the board regarding the adopting of a Resolution supporting Recontek proposal to locate an industrial waste recycling facility in Calhoun County, Florida authorizing the chairman, after approval by the board attorney and hazardous waste consultant, to execute the siting agreement and to work with Recontek, Inc., in the procuring and issuance of up to \$15,000,000.00 in Industrial Revenue Bonds
