CALHOUN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING NOVEMBER 10, 1992

PRESENT AND ACTING:

PACK BOWDEN, CHAIRMAN JOHN LINDSEY, VICE-CHAIRMAN ELLIS MELVIN DONNELL WHITFIELD TRUMAN GRANT

JOE TAYLOR, FINANCE DIRECTOR

MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER WITH PRAYER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

WEATHERIZATION BIDS WERE OPENED AND READ. BIDS WERE RECEIVED FROM JOE WEBB AND CHARLES F. BAILEY, JR. MR. WEBB WAS APPARENT LOW BIDDER ON ALL FOUR HOUSES. MOTION BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD TO ACCEPT LOW BID FROM MR. WEBB ON ALL FOUR HOUSES, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER MELVIN, CARRIED 5-0.

SONNY O'BRYAN REPORTED TO THE BOARD THAT IT WOULD BE AFTER NOVEMBER 20, 1992 BEFORE WORK COULD BE STARTED ON THE NEAL LANDING BOAT RAMP DUE TO THE HEIGHT OF THE RIVER AT THE CURRENT TIME.

AFTER DISCUSSION, IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD TO LET MATT FUQUA, COUNTY ATTORNEY, RESEARCH THE ISSUE OF SELLING PROPERTY AT THE AGRICULTURE-INDUSTRIAL PARK LOCATED ON HIGHWAY 71.

BOARD CORRESPONDENCE WAS PRESENTED.

FLORIDA TRANSCOR, INC. - RE: RETAINAGES - CONTRACT WITH DANNY HOWARD, HOWARD STRIPING COMPANY.

A FAX FROM JULIAN WEBB & ASSOCIATES, INC. WAS PRESENTED REGARDING THE CDBG GRANT.

A MEMORANDUM FROM SILAS GREENE, JR., VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER WAS PRESENTED.

THE CALHOUN COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT LOG FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 1992 WAS PRESENTED.

THE BOARD DISCUSSED COMMISSIONER MELVIN'S REQUEST FOR TWELVE SIGNS FOR HIS DISTRICT. MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER MELVIN TO ORDER AND APPROVE ROAD SIGNS FOR DISTRICT #3, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRANT. MOTION CARRIED 4-1, WITH COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD DISSENTING.

DISCUSSION WAS HELD CONCERNING THE 911 SYSTEM. CHAIRMAN BOWDEN AND JOE TAYLOR WILL RESEARCH AND REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD ON THE VARIOUS OPTIONS REGARDING THE 911 SYSTEM.

COMMISSIONER MELVIN REPORTED THAT MOSSY POND VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT WOULD BE INTERESTED IN MATCHING THE BCC 50/50 ON THE PRICE OF A NEW PUMP FOR A TANK TRUCK. DUE TO A SHORTAGE OF FUNDS THE BCC WAS UNABLE TO COMPLY.
