MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD TO AUTHORIZE PREBLE-RISH TO LET BIDS ON FEBRUARY 20, 1996 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF WILLIS BRIDGE WITH THE BID AWARD DATE OF MARCH 19, 1996 AT 5:00 P.M. COMMISSIONER CAPPS SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

SONNY O'BRYAN PRESENTED THE ADVERTISEMENT FOR THE REMOVAL & DISPOSAL WASTE TIRE PROPOSAL.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CAPPS AND SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRANT TO DESIGNATE THE MONTH OF APRIL 1996 AS AMNESTY MONTH AND TOXIC WASTE DAY APRIL 27, 1996. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

A SPECIAL MEETING WILL BE HELD FEBRUARY 20, 1996 AT 2:00 P.M. WITH THE "911" STREET NAMING COMMITTEE.

A HAZARD MITIGATION WORKSHOP IS SCHEDULED FOR THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 1996 AT 5:00 IN THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER.

TERRY OTWELL WITH METLIFE CAME BEFORE THE BOARD REQUESTING AUTHORIZATION TO CONTACT COUNTY EMPLOYEES REGARDING A METRO MATIC PROGRAM.

THE BCC AUTHORIZES MR. OTWELL TO CONTACT COUNTY EMPLOYEES ON THEIR OWN TIME REGARDING HIS INSURANCE PROGRAM.

EMORY GODWIN AND KEITH DANIELS ADDRESSED THE BOARD CONCERNING THE CALHOUN COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CAPPS TO SUPPORT THE CALHOUN COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD AND PUT THEM UNDER THE PROGRAM AS THE COUNTY FIREFIGHTERS TO ENABLE THEM TO BE COVERED UNDER WORKERS COMPENSATION. COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

WALLACE HOWARD ADDRESSED THE BCC REQUESTING HIS GRADER OPERATOR POSITION BACK.

COUNTY ATTORNEY FUQUA ADVISED MR. HOWARD THAT HE MUST GO THROUGH THE GRIEVANCE CHANNELS WITH THE UNION. THE BOARD CAN NOT DISCUSS THIS

MATTER WITHOUT THE UNION PRESENT.

LOGAN BARBEE AND KELLI PEACOCK CAME BEFORE THE BOARD REGARDING THE JOBS AND EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD TO APPOINT COMMISSIONER DUANE CAPPS AND LOGAN BARBEE TO SERVE ON THE JOBS AND EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP BOARD, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER GRANT. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

COUNTY ROAD SUPERINTENDENT ROBERT COONER ADDRESSED THE BCC REGARDING THE ROAD DEPARTMENT'S NEED TO PURCHASE A FLAT BED TRUCK.

THE BCC AUTHORIZED THE ROAD SUPERINTENDENT TO GET EVERYTHING IN ORDER TO HOLD AN AUCTION ON SURPLUS COUNTY PROPERTY.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CAPPS TO HOLD A WORKSHOP WITH THE COUNTY ENGINEERS FOR THE BOARD TO LOOK AT ROADS IN EACH DISTRICT AND DETERMINE THE NEED FOR RESURFACING. MOTION SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD AND CARRIED 3-1.

COMMISSIONER ATTAWAY IS NOT IN FAVOR OF SPENDING ANY MONEY UNTIL ALL LARGE PROJECTS ARE COMPLETED IN CASE THE NEED ARISES FOR MORE MONEY TO COMPLETE THE LARGE PROJECTS.

THE BCC ADDRESSED THE CDBG CONSULTANT SERVICES RANKING.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CAPPS TO NEGOTIATE WITH THE HIGHEST RANKED CONSULTANT, SOUTHERN RESEARCH CENTER, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD TO ACCEPT PROPOSAL OF SOUTHERN RESEARCH CENTER FOR 13.5% WITH ALL AUDIT FEES AND \$300 PER MONTH RENT TO THE BCC. COMMISSIONER GRANT SECONDED BY THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 4-0.

MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CAPPS TO HOLD WORKSHOP WITH THE COUNTY ENGINEERS FOR RESURFACING AND NEW CONSTRUCTION ON FEBRUARY 15, 1996, AT 5:00 P.M. COMMISSIONER WHITFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND MOTION CARRIED 3-1.

COMMISSIONER ATTAWAY DISCUSSED THE NEED FOR A SHELTER TO BE BUILT AT C. W. SHELTON PARK. THE BOARD AGREED THERE A SHELTER IS NEEDED AT THIS PARTICULAR PARK.

VOUCHERS FOR WARRANT #9609 WERE APPROVED FOR PAYMENT.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, THE BOARD DID ADJOURN.
