CHARLES LECROY, CDBG ADMINISTRATOR REQUESTS PAYMENT APPROVAL ON COMPLETED REHAB PROJECTS. VOUCHERS WILL BE PRESENTED FOR SIGNATURES FOR APPROVAL.

MR. LECROY STATED TO THE BCC THAT IF ANY WORK IS PERFORMED BY THIS GRANT (SEPTIC TANK, WELL OR REHAB), THE ENTIRE UNIT MUST BE BROUGHT UP TO CODE.

(COMMISSIONER GRANT ARRIVED AT THIS TIME.)

SPECIAL MEETING SET FOR JULY 23, 1996 TO RECEIVE CDBG BIDS AND SHIP BIDS AT 5:00 P.M.

MR. LECROY PRESENTED THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE CDBG GRANT FOR APPROVAL. THE BOARD CONCURRED ON THE APPROVAL OF SUCH.

(COMMISSIONER BOWDEN ARRIVED AT THIS TIME.)

MR. HERBERT "BUTCH" COUSINS ADDRESSED THE BCC REGARDING THE EASEMENTS AT MULE HAD AND MOSSY POND AREA.

MARTIN SEWELL, SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS ADDRESSED THE BOARD REGARDING THE DISPOSAL OF THE OLD VOTING PRECINCT BUILDINGS. FOLLOWING DISCUSSION IT WAS DETERMINED THAT THE BUILDINGS BE ADVERTISED FOR BIDS TO BE MOVED FROM THEIR PRESENT LOCATIONS.

BRIGHAM SHULER, CALHOUN COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH UNIT, ADDRESSED THE BOARD REGARDING THE MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM. THE BCC MUST BE THE APPLICANT FOR A GRANT. THE BCC MAY CONTRACT WITH THE CCPHU TO PERFORM THE MOSQUITO CONTROL.

FOLLOWING DISCUSSION, THE BOARD INSTRUCTED MR. SHULER TO PREPARE THE GRANT APPLICATION AND PRESENT IT TO MR. O'BRYAN FOR REVIEW. THE CHAIRMAN WILL MEET WITH THEM IF NECESSARY.

MR. DOWLING PARRISH. BUILDING INSPECTOR, ADDRESSED THE BOARD REGARDING HIS PAY INCREASE AT THE 11/24/92 SPECIAL MEETING. MR. PARRISH IS REQUESTING THE BCC PAY HIM THE DIFFERENCE IN WHAT HE HAS BEEN PAID AND WHAT IT WAS STATED IN THE MINUTES OF 11/24/92 SPECIAL MEETING HE WAS TO RECEIVE. (DEPUTY CLERK BRENDA TODD DID NOT TAKE MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING 11/24/92.)

THE BCC AGREED, UPON VERIFICATION WITH THE CLERK'S OFFICE, TO PAY DOWLING PARRISH THE DIFFERENCE OWED HIM ACCORDING TO THE PAY INCREASE APPROVED AT THE SPECIAL MEETING 11/24/92 AND WHAT HE HAS BEEN PAID, OVERTIME NOT INCLUDED.

MR. FRANK SNOWDEN, SNOWDEN LAND SURVEYING, REPORTED HE HAS FOUND NO RECORD OF DEED TO THE COUNTY ON CLAY MARY PARK.

COMMISSIONER CAPPS BROUGHT TO THE BCC'S ATTENTION THE CITIZENS' COMPLAINTS HE HAS RECEIVED REGARDING THE STRIPING OF COUNTY ROADS.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, THE BOARD DID ADJOURN.
