The meeting was called to order by Deputy Morris, prayer by Chairman Whitfield and pledge of allegiance to the flag.

At this time Chairman Whitfield relinquished the chair to Attorney Fuqua for the reorganization of the Board. Attorney Fuqua asked the Board for a nomination for Chairman and a motion was made by Commissioner Sewell to appoint Commissioner Whitfield as Chairman. Attorney Fuqua asked for a motion to cease the nomination and a motion was made by Commissioner Pickron, seconded by Commissioner Grant and carried. Attorney Fuqua asked for a motion to appoint a vice-chairman. A motion was made by Commissioner Grant to appoint Commissioner Pickron as vice-chairman seconded by Commissioner Sewell and carried.

There was no action presented from the Planning Commission.

Chairman Whitfield presented Resolution # 20 establishing the adoption of the final budget for Calhoun County for Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2001. After discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Sewell, seconded by Commissioner Pickron and carried to adopt Resolution # 20 in the amount of \$10,780,282.00.

A Public Hearing was held at this time to adopt a Resolution approving a joint program with the Housing Finance Authority of Bay County. After discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Grant seconded by Commissioner Hunt and carried to adopt said resolution.

(CST) on December 4, 2001 and opened and read aloud on December 4, 2001 at 2:00 P.M. (CST).

Mr. O'Bryan asked the Board to discuss several problems with the hauling from Marianna Lime. After a lengthy discussion the Board decided to pay freight at the rates noted in the contract. No further Board action was taken.

Mr. O'Bryan presented to the Board for execution the Economic Development Transportation Fund Grant Agreement for Oglesby Plants International, Inc., on Bodiford/Oglesby Road in the amount of \$315,590.00. The Board appointed Mr. O'Bryan to be the Project Administrator on this project. After discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Hunt, seconded by Commissioner Sewell and carried to execute said Agreement.

At this time Ms. Brinkley introduced the Keep Calhoun County Beautiful Committee and Ms. Karen Wakeford with Keep America Beautiful. Ms. Wakeford presented to Chairman Whitfield and the Board a Certification Certificate from Keep America Beautiful, Inc.

Ms. Samatha Taylor with the Chamber of Commerce asked the Board to advertise for a Public Hearing in reference to the Calhoun County Enterprize Zone Strategic Plan 2001-2005. After discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Grant seconded by Commissioner Sewell and carried to advertise for the Public Hearing.

The minutes of October 16, 2001 and November 6, 2001 were approved as presented.

Attorney Fuqua presented to the Board for execution Resolution # 22 in reference to redistricting in Calhoun County. After discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Hunt seconded by Commissioner Sewell and carried to execute said resolution.

Commissioner Pickron stated that a fence had been cleaned out and no ditch was left. Approximately 8' of the right-of-way was taken. After discussion the Board asked Commissioner Pickron to contact Harold Pickron, Road Superintendent to discuss this problem with the individual.

Commissioner Pickron made a motion to reject any bids that are not presented to the Board on time, seconded by Commissioner Hunt and carried. Commissioner Whitfield stated that bids received late by the Board had been rejected before.

Commissioner Whitfield stated he would like for the Board to contract with Roumellis Planning for a CDBG Infrastructure Hud Grant. Commissioner Whitfield stated he would give Commissioner Grant some of his Weatherization and Ship money because Commissioner Grant's district did not qualifying for the Hud Grant.
