The meeting was called to order by Chairman Flowers at 5:01 p.m., CT.

Prayer and pledge allegiance to the flag were led by Joe Wood, Public Works Director.

Chairman Flowers turned the floor over to Clerk Hand.

Clerk Hand advised the Board this is the final Budget Hearing for the Calhoun County Board of County Commissioners.

Clerk Hand advised Board of the Proposed Millage Rate of 10.000 mills. This is 2.98% below the current year rolled back rate of 10.3073.

· There is a decrease in the ad valorem taxes from the prior year

Clerk Hand informed Board the maximum millage rate is 10.0000 mills; the BOCC can vote to adopt a lesser rate. The adoption of 10.0000 or below requires the majority vote of the BOCC (3 OF 5). Compliance with the voting requirements will be measured by the vote on final adoption of the levy of the millage AT THIS HEARING and certified on FORM DR-487V.

A motion to approve the Chairman's recommendations was made by Commissioner Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Grant and passed unanimously 5-0.

Clerk Hand informed the Board of the Millage Rate with approved changes

- a. Millage rate 10.000
- b. Less than the rolled-back rate of 10.3073 by 2.98%

Chairman Flowers called for public comment

a. Gene Bailey

c.

- i. Mr. Bailey addressed the Board and provided them with extracts from previous Board minutes to clarify to the Board a millage rate of 10 mills was not necessary to qualify for a grant.
- ii. Mr. Bailey inquired about \$187,500 in Org code 12541-71000 County Transportation Trust Fund 2- Debt Service. He also stated there is an interest payment in the budget of \$23,060 and asked what this is for. Clerk Hand stated this loan was obtained for matching an HMGP Grant. Mr. Bailey asked how much was borrowed. The Clerk responded \$750,038.

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- iii. Mr. Bailey inquired about \$525,000 in Org Code 01519-64000 Equipment for Courthouse. Clerk Hand stated the amount included \$500,000 for the Courthouse HVAC unit and was reduced to \$25,000 in a previous meeting.
- iv. Mr. Bailey inquired if the Board had reduced the amount paid to the Lobbyist. Chairman Flowers stated the Board had reduced the amount paid to the Lobbyist from \$36,000 to \$12,000 annually.
- v. Mr. Bailey requested the Board cut \$120,000 from the ad valorem taxes resulting in a 3% savings to the taxpayers – the same percentage as County employees are receiving in pay increases for 2013-14.

Chairman Flowers asked for any other public comment. The record reflects there was no further public comment.

Chairman Flowers closed the session for public comment.

The Chairman turned the meeting back over to the Clerk to present the resolutions for the adoption by the Board. The Clerk began reading Budget Resolution #2013-28 and the Chairman asked if the Board could adopt a lesser millage rate. The Clerk stated that would have to be done prior to adoption of the Budget Resolution, and if a lesser rate was adopted the Board would have to determine whether or not additional expenditures would be cut or if the reserves would be reduced. Clerk Hand stated the amount needed is approximately \$37,136.

Clerk Hand stated reducing the millage rate would cause a slight reduction (approximately \$3,700) in Amendment One funds. The Property Appraiser explained these are funds fiscally restrained counties receive from the State based on reductions in taxable value.

Commissioner Shelton made a motion to further reduce 01513-51349 by \$37,136 enabling the Board to adopt a 9.9000 millage rate. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Brown and passed 3 to 2 with Commissioner McDougald and Commissioner Grant voting no.

Chairman Flowers turned the meeting over to Clerk Hand to present the resolutions for adoption by the Board. Clerk Hand read Budget Resolution #2013-28

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WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Calhoun County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the Board of County Commissioners of Calhoun County as \$390,896,516.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Calhoun County, Florida, that:

- 1. The FY 2013-2014 operating millage rate of 9.9 mills is less than the rolled-back rate of 10.3073 mills by 3.95%.
- 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
